Despite global challenges including the war in Ukraine and continued effects of Covid-19, all of which had a direct impact on prices, Guyana earned the title of fastest growing economy in the world.

This year's budget was presented by Senior Minister of Finance, Dr. Ashni Singh under the theme "Improving lives today, building prosperity for tomorrow".

Bolstered by the first installment of Carbon Credit receipts and withdrawals from the Natural Resources Fund, Budget 2023 delivers a package of \$781.9 billion towards the creation of a strong foundation for the future.



Personal Income Tax

ALLOWANCES AND DEDUCTIONS

▶ Increase in income tax threshold (personal allowance) from \$75,000 to \$85,000 per month

Remains unchanged

- ▶ Personal Income Tax rates of 28% and 40% on the next \$150,000 per month and the remainder, respectively
- ▶ Personal allowance of 1/3 of chargeable income, where this is higher than \$85,000

Value-Added Tax

REMOVAL

- ▶ New All-Electric Motor Vehicles (not hybrid) of any power rating
- Residential Properties

Remains unchanged

- ▶ VAT Rate of 14%
- ▶ VAT Registration threshold of \$15,000,000
- Existing zero-rated/exempt items

Wear & Tear Allowances

NEW

► All-electric motor vehicles - 50% per annum

Excise Tax

RELIEF

- ▶ Used vehicles below 1500 cc, the current tax rate is replaced with a flat rate of \$800,000.
- Extension of relief on fuel as long as prices remain elevated

Customs Duties

REDUCTION

▶ New vehicles below 1500 cc, reduction from 45% to 35%

RELIEF

Extension of relief on freight charges in cost of imports to 31 December 2023

Other Taxes

WEAR & TEAR ALLOWANCES

▶ All-electric motor vehicles - 50% per Annum

Remains unchanged

- Capital gains tax
- Property tax
- ▶ Withholding Tax
- Stamp Duties

Despite not being announced in the 2022 budget presentation, the 28% band for income taxes was adjusted in the legislation tabled in Parliament. These computations do not account for any potential changes in this band for 2023.





Development initiatives

RENEWABLE ENERGY

- ▶ 30,000 solar PV home lighting systems in hinterland and riverain areas
- ▶ 6 public electric vehicle charging stations
- ▶ Relaunch of request for proposals for Amaila Falls
- ▶ 1.5MW Hydropower Facility at Kumu
- ▶ 14 Oil blocks available on auction
- ▶ \$202.9 million for development of single window Information Technology Platform

Other measures

HEALTH

- ▶\$15.7 billion allocated to infrastructural works, rehabilitation and construction of hospitals
- ▶\$900 million allocated to addressing mental health and other non-communicable diseases
- ▶\$500 million allocated to training of healthcare professionals

INFRASTRUCTURE

- ▶ Allocation of \$136 billion to enhance roads and bridges, including \$10.3 billion for continued works on Ogle to Eccles road and \$5 billion for new Demerara River Bridge
- ► Allocation of \$19.7 billion for drainage and irrigation

FINANCIAL SECTOR REFORM

- Simplify process of opening a bank account for low-risk customers
- Legal amendments to allow movable collateral and financial receivables to be pledged as security for financing



Support

EXISTING ENTITIES

- ▶ \$1.5 billion for construction of the new laboratory for Bureau of Standards
- ▶\$4 billion for Guyana Sugar Corporation including new and expanded packaging plants at Albion and Blairmont respectively

Home Ownership

▶ Increase in low-income mortgage loan ceiling from \$15 million to \$20 million

Education

- ▶ Increase in "Because We Care" cash grant from \$25,000 to \$35,000 per student
- ▶ \$1.8 billion for GOAL scholarship program

Pensioners

▶ Old age pensions of \$33,000 per month, increasing from \$28,000

Public Assistance

► Grants of \$16,000 per month to individuals living under distressed circumstances, increasing from \$14,000
